Historically Barcelona has been a pioneering and innovative city in many areas. It was also in the **struggle for the rights of LGBTQ+ people**: it was the birthplace of the Spanish LGTBQ+ Movement and hosted its **first Pride in 1977**.

More than 40 years after that event, Barcelona has amply demonstrated its openness, solidarity and its capacity to anticipate the times and become a benchmark. The celebration of the **1992 Olympic Games** was a clear example of this.

Over the years, the LGBTQ+ community has **achieved many rights** that were unthinkable: now we are visible in almost all areas of society, we can get married, we have social recognition, the law protects us against attacks and homophobic attacks, bisexuals and intersexuals are increasingly visible and even trans* people have seen their rights improve.

1. INTRODUCTION

In spite of the above, **these are not** good times for the LGBTQ+

collective: the proliferation of right-wing populism and the rise of far-right political parties has led to the growth of LGTBQ-phobia. Right-wing parties and even liberals, who traditionally had not oppose LGBTQ+ rights, now with their desire for power, are accomplices of extreme right-wing parties that aim to remove or reduce the rights that have been hard-won.

Discourses of LGBTQ-fobia, threats and persecution against LGBTQ+ people, activists and Prides, complicity with right-wing ideologies, great campaigns launched shamelessly by politicians in the media are penetrating deep into those intolerant who until now were appeased.

In Barcelona, in the first months of 2019, there has been an **increase of 25% in LGBTQ-phobic incidents** or attacks, compared to the same period of 2018. Even the recently inaugurated **Barcelona LGTBQ+ Center** – pioneer in the Spanish state – has been attacked and vandalized just a week after its opening.

NI UN PASO ATRÁS.

The time has come for the **2.0** claim of the LGBTQ+ collective,

the one that claims that nobody can eliminate the rights obtained during decades of struggle. We are not alone: many countries in Europe are living this situation. Sweden, Norway, Finland, Denmark, Estonia, Netherlands, Germany, France, Austria, Cyprus, Greece, Bulgaria, Italy, Hungary, Slovakia, Switzerland...

Europe can not afford to take a step back. Barcelona will not allow the struggle of more than 40 years of activism and rights achieved to recede. The celebration of the Europride 2022 will publicly send a strong message of firmness to the entire community and to LGBTQ-phobic people. We want to be the voice of all Europe and to say clearly that **WE WILL NEVER TAKE A STEP BACK!**

We can count with the support from the Mayor

Current Mayor of Barcelona, **Ada Colau**, is an activist and politician.

On June 2015 she was elected Mayor of Barcelona, the first woman to hold the office.

Colau was one of the founding members and spokespeople of the Plataforma de Afectados por la Hipoteca (PAH) (Platform for People Affected by Mortgages), which was set up in Barcelona in 2009 in response to the rise in evictions caused by unpaid mortgage loans and the collapse of the Spanish property market in the wake of the 2008 financial crisis.

The city of Barcelona





Barcelona and its history

The first human settlements in Barcelona date back to **Neolithic** times. The city itself was founded by the Romans who set up a colony called Barcino at the end of the 1st century BC. The colony had some thousands of inhabitants and was bounded by a defensive wall, the remains of which can still be seen in the old town. For over 200 years, Barcelona was under Muslim rule, and, following the Christian reconquest, it became a county of the Carolingian Empire and one of the main residences of the court of the Crown of Aragon. The fruitful medieval period established Barcelona's position as the economic and political centre of the Western Mediterranean. The city's Gothic Quarter bears witness to the splendour enjoyed by the city from the 13th to the 15th centuries.

From the 15th to 18th centuries Barcelona entered a period of decline, while it struggled to maintain its economic and political independence. This struggle ended in 1714, when the city fell to the Bourbon troops and Catalonia's and Catalans' rights and privileges were suppressed. A period of cultural recovery began in the mid-19th century with the arrival of the development of the textile industry. During this period, which was known as the Renaixença, Catalan re-gained prominence as a literary language. The 20th century ushered in widespread **urban renewal** throughout Barcelona city, culminating in its landmark Eixample district, which showcases some of Barcelona's most distinctive Catalan art-nouveau. or modernista, buildings. The Catalan Antoni Gaudí. one of the most eminent architects, designed buildings such as the Casa Milà (known as La Pedrera, the Catalan for stone quarry), the Casa Batlló and the Sagrada Família church, which have become world-famous landmarks. The freedoms achieved during this period were severely restricted

During the **Civil War** in 1936 and the subsequent dictatorship. With the reinstatement of democracy in 1977, Barcelona society regained its economic strength and the Catalan language was restored.

Furthermore the **first spanish** Pride took place in 1977 in Barcelona, which was the first manifestation in Spain and in the mediterranean part of Europe. The city's hosting of the 1992 Olympic Games gave fresh impetus to Barcelona's potential and reaffirmed its status as a major metropolis. In 2004, the Forum of Cultures reclaimed industrial zones to convert them into residential districts. An example of the renewed vigour with which Barcelona is looking towards the 21st century.



Franco era: Homosexuality was highly illegal under the dictatorship of Francisco Franco, with **laws against homosexual activity** vigorously enforced and homosexual people being imprisoned in large numbers.

The 1954 reform of the 1933 "Ley de vagos y maleantes" ("**Vagrancy Act**") declared homosexuality illegal. The text of the law declares that "this law is not intended to punish, but to correct and reform". However, the way the law was applied was clearly **punitive and arbitrary** and it was often used against suspected political dissenters.

However, in the 1960s clandestine gay scenes began to **emerge** in Spain. Further establishments would start to appear in Barcelona, an especially tolerant city under Franco's regime, and in the countercultural centers of Ibiza and Sitges. Attitudes in greater Spain began to **change** with the return to democracy after Franco's death through a cultural movement known as **La movida**.



LGBTQ+ History

«There has been a great progress towards LGBTQ+ equality and non-discrimination in

Spain in the last 40 years. The LGBTQ+ community that was once prosecuted, and even imprisoned, has now become an integral part of the Spanish society. As for Barcelona, the Catalan city has turned into an important economic asset and an active driver of the tourism industry.»

1979 Spain decriminalizes

homosexuality as part of several post-Franco reforms; the Madrid Gay Pride Parade, known as "Orgullo Gay", is first held in June that year.

2000 Jerónimo Saavedra becomes the first parliamentary to **come out** as gay.

2005 Same-sex marriage is **legalized** (with joint adoption).

2007 Europride took place in Madrid with about 2.5 million people and more than 300 events over a week to celebrate Spain as the country with the most developed LGBT rights in the world. The same year, Jerónimo Saavedra becomes the first openly gay mayor of any provincial capital in Spain (Las Palmas de Gran Canaria).

2008 Gay Eurogames in Barcelona

2012 Spain's highest court upheld the country's **gay marriage law** on November 6, 2012, rejecting an appeal lodged by the ruling People's Party and confirming the legality of same-sex unions.



Political context

Our days



The year 2019 began with the achievement of a historical vindication of the LGBTQ+ Movement: the **first LGBTQ+ Center** in Spain is inaugurated. It is self-managed by the associative movement and it offers a meeting and assistance point for LGBTQ+people.



However, the growth of right-wing populists and the emergence of new far-right political formations jeopardizes the achievements of the last 40 years.





Just a week after the opening, the LGBTQ+ Center was attacked leaving the entry glass broken and the exterior walls painted with LGBTQ-phobic expressions and fascist's symbols.

In 2018, according with the data from Observatorio Contra la Homofobia, they were reported **114 LGBTQ-phobic incidents**; in 2019 until now more than 75..

Some political formations with parliamentary representation are doing **public declarations against LGBTQ+ persons** and they are starting a witch hunting against the LGBTQ+ movement



Attractions and sights

Sagrada Família

Construction of Barcelona's iconic (but controversial) church is expected to be completed in 2026, a century after the death of its architect.

Labyrinth Park

This semi-secret storybook hedge maze is also the oldest garden in the city.

Casa Batlló

One of Antoni Gaudí's most classic buildings is well-known for its "dragon-back" design.

Park Güell

Gaudí's famously flamboyant architectural style is on full display in this sprawling park and garden.

Bunkers del Carmel


These secluded and abandoned anti-aircraft defenses have become one the most scenic viewpoints in Barcelona.



Culture, exhibitions, festivals, music and theatre

Art, culture, science and entertainment come together in Barcelona's museums: Egyptian mummies and contemporary works of art, the city's Roman origins and one of Europe's biggest sports clubs...





Barcelona has **many venues for live music and theatre**, including the world-renowned *Gran Teatre del Liceu* opera house, the *Teatre Nacional de Catalunya*, the *Teatre Lliure* and the *Palau de la Música Catalana* concert hall. Barcelona also is home to the *Barcelona Symphony* and *Catalonia National Orchestra*, the largest symphonic orchestra in Catalonia.





In 1999, the OBC inaugurated its new venue in the brand-new Auditorium. It performs around 75 concerts per season and its current director is Eiji Oue. It is home to the Barcelona Guitar Orchestra, directed by Sergi Vicente. The major thoroughfare of La Rambla is home to mime artists and street performers. Yearly, two major pop music festivals take place in the city, the Sónar Festival and the Primavera Sound Festival. The city also has a thriving alternative music scene, with groups such as The Pinker Tones receiving international attention.



Gastronomy, food, nature and sport

From the medieval time to the modern creative catalan cuisine

If we're talking about gastronomy in Barcelona, we can't fail to mention **Catalan cuisine**. Catalonia is a gastronomic paradise, where Catalan cuisine is a mouthwatering blend of heritage, produce, terroir, tradition, creativity, innovation...

All of these things, together with an endless love of fine-dining culture, make discovering it with your palate a truly appealing option. Catalonia's gastronomic heritage can be traced back to medieval times and is still based on the value of produce and terroir stemming from locally sourced, seasonal ingredients that reflect the vast wealth of the Catalan landscape: the sea, the mountains, vegetable gardens, orchards and woodland... This tradition has given rise to such popular recipes as *escudella i carn d'olla*, a type of *pot au feu*, and a chargrilled vegetable salad known as *escalivada*, to name just two of the typical dishes that bring the wealth of our produce to your plate.

Produce brought in daily to all the city's food markets and a key ingredient of the Mediterranean Diet, which was awarded Intangible Cultural Heritage status by UNESCO in 2010. And, in addition to the exquisite and varied traditional historic recipes, we have to add the creative signature cuisine that has put many of our restaurants at the forefront of cuisine around the world. After receiving such accolades, it comes as no surprise that Catalonia was named **European Region of Gastronomy** in 2016.













Transport: subway, tram and bus

Traffic situation within the city

Barcelona is an easy city for getting around.

According to the European Cities Monitor it has **one of the best internal transport system in Europe**.

Its local metro and bus systems cover the whole city with frequent and comfortable services. But Barcelona is also a compact city, meaning that much of the time delegates/attendees can walk to where they want to get to. There's also an advanced system of safe cycle tracks criss-crossing town, and thanks to the great climate, cycling is a favorite means of local transport.

Rush hour traffic concentrates in the early morning and evening mainly due to those commuting, although the city's ring roads have cut a significant amount of traffic from the inner city.

The best recommendation is to use the fast and efficient local public transport.

Public transport net in the city



Metro system

The Barcelona Metro is an extensive network of 12 rapid transit electrified railway lines that run mostly underground in central Barcelona and into the city's suburbs.



Bus

TMB operates a fleet of over 1.000 buses, 70% of which are adapted for people with reduced mobility.



Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat-FGC

The Ferrocarrils de la Generalitat-FGC, run by the Catalan government, supplements the metro network with a city railway network.



Tram

Barcelona tramway system, known as the Tram, was relaunched in 2004. This means of transport, which was abolished in 1971, is now an accessible, environmentally friendly, fast and comfortable system. It consists of two sections; the Diagonal Baix Llobregat and the Ciutadella-Besos (CCIB area)



Train, Renfe

Barcelona has also an extensive network of commuter trains, operated by RENFE the Spanish National Railway Company, which depart from main stations every five or ten minutes. The train's ability provides comfortable and rapid access to the city centre from the outskirts of the city.









Integrated Fare System

The Integrated Fare System makes it possible to use the different modes of transport (Underground, bus, tram, FGC and Renfe) in the same journey within the Metropolitan Region extended to the limits of the local rail services, including the Airport.



You can have all the information you need on public transport and service status to hand thanks to TMB App. It's free and available for Android and iOS.

Through the app you can access all TMB information quickly and easily: look up routes, nearest public transport, bus due times, operating hours, maps, alerts and everything you need to know for your journeys. Special discounts for congress organizers

The Public Transport Company (TMB) offers discounts for congress & events organisers, up to 70% discount of the full rate, tickets of 2, 3, 4 and 5 days.

All these transport cards are valid for unlimited number of Underground, TMB Bus (Barcelona Metropolitan Transport), Airport train, FGC urban line and Tramcar.



LGBTQ+ life: community and hotspot

A huge LGBTQ+ scene, fabulous sandy beaches and stunning historical sights make Barcelona one of **Europe's most popular LGBTQ+ friendly destinations**.

We are not only offering a wide range of bars, clubs and pubs Barcelona also offers several beaches and cultural projects and programs for the LGBTQ+ community. Beside this, **Barcelona has it ´s own LGBTQ Centre**, which is the city's reference space for issues concerning LGBTQ (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transsexual and queer) people.

The Centre offers the LGBTQ community and all other citizens a transversal public facility that provides a wide range of information, advisory and direct assistance services, all in coordination with the relevant associations and organisations and the competent authorities.



LGBTQ+ life: community and hotspot



The LGBTQ Centre also presents a cultural, community action and awareness-raising programme that is open to all citizens and complements the activities organised by the various associations that use its facilities, whether permanently or occasionally.

All this makes Barcelona LGBTQ Centre a place for **meeting**, **thinking and highlighting issues related to sexual and gender diversity**.

The Centre works to defend LGBTQ rights and the provisions established in Law 11/2014, the Municipal Plan for Sexual and Gender Diversity 2016-2020 and other legislation relevant to the fight to eradicate discrimination against LGBTQ people.



Accommodations

Actual number of hotels and bedrooms

Barcelona city offers today 37.927 rooms in all categories, and has new projects for around 4.045 more to be completed in the coming years. We describe hereunder in detail the capacities in 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 stars properties. VAT on accommodation is 10%.

How to get to BCN

PLANE



Barcelona airport, with several terminals, is located 16 kilometres south of the city and is also known as Josep Tarradellas Barcelona-El Prat. Barcelona has more than 200 direct daily routes.

The Josep Tarradellas Barcelona-El Prat offers a wide range of **national and international flights** and airlines operating, both **low cost and traditional**. Vueling, LEVEL, EasyJet, RyanAir, Norwegian or EuroWings offer round trip flights from and to all destinations in Europe starting at 39€.



TRAIN

Barcelona has **direct railway high speed links** with a number of important cities, including Paris, Lyon, Marseille, Toulouse, and the high-speed train runs to Madrid, southern and eastern Spain. The city's major railway stations and metropolitan rail network ensure you can travel to Barcelona and anywhere by train without any difficulties.



BUS

The bus station in Barcelona that has the most **national and international connections** is Barcelona Nord Bus Station. Buses also depart from Barcelona Sants station and other areas of the city.

CAR

Barcelona is **well connected** and has a large amount of car parks. The motorway and road network will take you anywhere in the city by car although it's worth bearing in mind that traffic can be heavy at the main entry points of Barcelona during rush hour.



BOAT

Barcelona has become the Mediterranean's foremost **cruise ship harbour**. It has nine passenger terminals, seven for cruise liners and four for ferries. It has connections with the Balearic Islands and the main Mediterranean harbours.



Safety & Health

HEALTH

EU Citizens are entitled to the **full range of healthcare services in public hospitals**, but you will need to present your European Health Insurance Card (enquire at your national health service before leaving home). Non-EU citizens have to pay for services.



SAFETY

Barcelona is a safe city. With a rating of 85% Spain, is ranked 17th out of 162 on the ranking of the safest and most dangerous countries. Barcelona is a bit more dangerous because of the high number of tourists being pickpocket targets so be mindful of your belongings, particularly in crowded areas, take nothing of value to the beach and don't leave anything unattended.

Since 2008, Barcelona hosts the **most important LGBTQ+ Pride celebration** in the Mediterranean: *Pride! BCN*.

For more than a week, the city celebrates an event of **both a protesting and a festive nature**, reinforcing the commitment of

More than **380,000 people** come every year, making it one of the most popular Prides in Europe. Although the *Pride! 
Pride! BCN offers a program for everyone.




Political program

Italy's nationalist league formed a populist coalition in Italy. Spain once thought a barren ground for such politics - elected multiple far-right politicians to parliament for the first time since the country returned to democracy in 1975.

And until this week, Austria's Freedom Party was in coalition with the centre right, before their leader was caught up in a video scandal.

Also on other sides of the world the far right wing and the people who are against the LGBTQ+ rights




